


However, the best way to learn about the magic of colors and color theory is to create your very own version.

5. THE COMPLEMENTARY COLOR EXPERIMENT YOU SHOULD TRY

Opposites on the color wheel will succeed in bringing out the most of the color that you are trying to highlight.

The opposite colors themselves are called <u>complementary colors</u>. Common complementary colors include red and green, orange and blue, or yellow and purple. In order to understand the power that complementary colors have over one another, you will begin by putting them together.

You can also use the darker option as a base then apply the brighter of the two on top in any shape to see how the color pops.

When you are done, recreate this with colors that are not considered complementary to see the true difference. You will notice that a yellow star on a purple background is much brighter than a yellow star on a red background.

You will begin by pouring a reasonable amount of dish soap into the cup. Your goal is to make a deep enough dish soap supply to be able to effectively dip your brush in.

Anywhere from a quarter inch and beyond should be beneficial for this process.

After you have filled your cup with dish soap, you can begin to coat your brush. You will carry out this process by dipping and swirling the paint brush in the dish soap. This is a great method for learning how to clean an oil paint brush using household products.

Once the paint brush is thoroughly coated, you can repeat the steps from previous method. You will want to either wipe or paint until the brush looks completely clean to the naked eye. It is important to make sure that you do not miss any hidden bristles in the middle of the brush.
